More than economic harm

If you suspect economic harm is occurring, other forms of family violence may also be present.

Family violence agencies are best placed to work with you to establish whether other forms of harm are occurring in your relationship and we would encourage you to call one of the agencies listed on the other side of this support sheet.

It is important to take some form of action to stop or address economic harm, but only when it is **safe** to do so.

If your safety is at immediate risk, please call the New Zealand Police – 111









Possible signs of economic harm:

- Limited or no access to money or resources
- Child support isn't being paid
- Your employment situation becomes difficult due to constant harassment
- The car is damaged so you can't go anywhere
- Court processes are intentionally dragged out

Individually these warnings may mean very little, however several together could indicate economic harm.
